Dear Sir/Madam,

We are contacting you regarding the case of Mrs. Spaska Mitrova, a citizen of both, the Republic of Macedonia and the Republic of Bulgaria. This is an issue that has been a major concern of ours during the last eight months.

Mrs. Mitrova was arrested on June 29, 2009 by an unnecessarily spectacular operation of a disproportionately large group of police officers after she had been sentenced by the Macedonian Court of Justice to three months imprisonment after a trial stained by many irregularities. Mrs. Mitrova was sentenced for allegedly not allowing her husband to see their child after separating from him. To our knowledge this is the only case in the Macedonian judicial history that a mother was imprisoned for such a petty "crime".
